Children and Young People We welcome any children of primary school age to join the activities we have prepared for them and there are also activities for under-fives (accompanied by their parent or carer).

Arrangements for today 5-11s group. During this session, we will be working on special art activities related to the Great East Window. To give this work more time, please come straight to the Zouche when you arrive in the Minster. Under 5s will go to their group during the second hymn as usual on these dates. If there is anything that we need to know about your child's needs, please accompany your child to the Zouche Chapel and speak to one of the leaders. When the administration of communion begins please go to pick up your child from the Zouche Chapel so that they can come to the communion rail with you. If you are not sure of the location of the Zouche Chapel, please ask a Steward to direct you.

Updating our records A reminder for all parents and carers that the Minster is renewing its records and the information that we hold. Forms were given a few weeks ago now and we need the information back from you as soon as possible please. Please return your information forms to one of the Leaders when you collect your children. Summer placement We are delighted to welcome Jo Barr for a placement over the summer. Sharing and Developing Faith In the June 2017 Minster Bulletin, Canon Chris wrote about a pilot project that he had run during the Easter season that year. 10 people from across the Minster Community were invited into his and Sue's home to test an idea for sharing and developing faith. Using the story of the journey of two disciples walking along the Road to Emmaus after the crucifixion, who are encountered by the Risen Christ, the pilot project consisted of four sessions, the basic purpose of which was to provide an opportunity for the participants to share their own faith story and listen to that of others. The pilot project was highly successful and, since then, there have been two further courses, with another one being planned for this autumn. Silence in the Minster The final *Silence in the Minster* this year, organised by The York Minster Pilgrimage Group, takes place on Wednesday 25 July from 7.00 to 9.00pm. The evening will start with Canon Chris Collingwood giving a talk on how to use silence, drawing on the deep well of teaching, resources and experience in the Christian contemplative tradition, before leading periods of silent meditation. Occasional readings of poetry, together with music, will also help to sustain an atmosphere of stillness and calm. The evening will conclude with a contemplative service of night prayer. The evening is open to all, whether you are a person of faith or not, or whether you already have experience of contemplative prayer and meditation. Those taking part will also have the opportunity to explore the space of the Minster by wandering around at will or just sitting in silence and letting the Minster 'speak.' *This event is free. All welcome. Access is via the North West Door from 6.30 pm.*

Discovering God's Love – York Minster's Mission weekend led by the Archbishop of York 28 – 30

September 2018. Over the past two years the Archbishop has been spending many weekends leading Mission's in Deaneries around the diocese. At the end of September he is coming to lead a Mission here. There will be many opportunities for us to bring family and friends to events at the Minster to see the Archbishop, to share in worship with him or maybe even to meet him. On Friday evening we will have our Harvest Thanksgiving, led by children and young people, followed by a Ceilidh in the Minster. About 100 members of our community shared in this last year and our aim is that about 200 people should share in it this year, because we are all asked to bring others with us. The Archbishop will be Chaplain for the Day in the Minster on the Saturday, leading the hourly prayers, presiding at the midday Eucharist and being available to speak and pray informally with anyone who is in the Minster. An entertaining and informative evening event is being planned to which we can bring family, friends and neighbours. On Sunday the Choral Eucharist will have the theme of renewing baptismal promises and we will be encouraging those baptised in the Minster over recent years, and anyone else who wants to renew their baptismal promises, to come and share in this service. Plans are well in hand for this great weekend. A message from our Lifestyle Environment Sustainability and Stewardship (LESS) group Being in the midst of a heat-wave at this present time, could we this month focus on the preciousness of water? We are so blessed to have clean running water from taps in our homes, but it is a finite resource, and we should

treat it as such. Putting the plug in the basin uses less water than washing your hands or cleaning your teeth, under a running tap. A shower uses less water than a bath. A water butt in your garden collects rainwater ready for your watering jobs at such a time as this. Taking some of your grey water (washing up water for example) out to water the garden also saves unnecessary usage of highly treated clean water. What else might you think of to do?
