Please also ensure that you do not leave any bags unattended. *Access for our daily early morning services, including the 8 o'clock on Sundays, and Evensong in the evenings, is by the south door.

Groups for children and young people during the 10.00 am service

Welcome to all children who are sharing in our worship today with their parents and carers. On Easter Day, groups for under 5s and 5-11s meet as usual. All children are welcome to join in with the prepared activities. The 5-11s group meets in the Zouche Chapel. Under 5s gather in the Consistory Court and should be accompanied by their parents or carers. If you would like to join either group, please follow the cross during the gradual hymn. If there is anything that we need to know about your child, please speak with any of the leaders. When the administration of communion begins please go to the Zouche Chapel to collect your child so that they can share in this part of the service. Please ask a steward if you do not know where to find the Zouche Chapel and someone will show you the way.

The children's groups will take a break after Easter, and will not meet on Sunday 28 April. Both groups will begin again on Sunday 5 May.

No coffee today

There will be no coffee following the 10.00 am Eucharist this morning, but normal caffeine levels will be restored next Sunday, 28 April.

Notre Dame

In addition to praying for the community of Notre Dame, we have offered to send to Paris a number of our working community who have gained experience and expertise through dealing with the aftermath of the fire in York Minster in 1984. In time it may be that we will share in some fundraising for the re-building of the Cathedral but for the time being we are offering prayer, people and friendship.

A new role for York Minster's Canon Precentor

The Reverend Canon Peter Moger, who has been Canon Residentiary and Precentor of York Minster since 2010, has been appointed to a post in the Scottish Episcopal Church. Peter will be the Episcopalian (Anglican) priest on the Island of Lewis in the Outer Hebrides. He will be based in Stornoway, the largest town of the Western Isles of Lewis and Harris. Peter will have responsibility for two churches: St Peter's, Stornoway and St Moluag's, Eoropie. The exact date of Peter and his wife Heather's move to Lewis is still to be confirmed as there are some practical matters still to be arranged. However, they hope to move from York in the Autumn. Commenting on his new role, Peter said: 'This post represents an enormous change—from the Church of England to the Scottish Episcopal Church, and from cathedral to local church ministry—but carries exciting challenges and possibilities. The Western Isles have a rich historic tradition of Christian faith and worship. It will be a privilege to be a part of that, following God's call to share with the people of St Peter's and St Moluag's in ministry and mission to local communities and to the many visitors to the islands.' Please pray for Peter and Heather as they prepare to say farewell to York, and to plan their move north.
