**Questionnaire from 'The Minority Anglican Project'** The Edward Cadbury Centre for the Public Understanding of Religion, at the Philosophy, Theology & Religion dept. at Birmingham University, is conducting a research study commissioned by the Church of England on how we can better support Minority Ethnic Christians in the Church of England. We hope to be able to achieve a nuanced understanding of what it means to belong and to participate in Christian fellowship, within and beyond the Church of England. You do not have to be either minority ethnic, or even a part of the C of E, to participate in the study. In a research vacuum, we need a broader parameter of data to understand the conditions specific to the C of E, and therefore we need control samples to understand a nuanced picture, so participants need only be: over 18 years old; live in the UK/British Isles; self-identify as a Christian.
