Children and young people during the 10.00 am service Welcome to all children sharing in our worship today. Our children's groups are now on their summer break, and we will welcome them back in September. If you have a child who is feeling a bit restless during the service, then there are books and bean bags in St Nick's Chapel, down the left hand side of the Nave, and on the far side of the transept. Please ask a steward to direct you, if this would be helpful.

Visiting Choir We welcome, and thank the choir of St Wulfram's Church, Grantham, which is singing the services today, and has been singing the choral services in the Minster over the past week. St Wulfram's Church Choir is a renowned parish church choir, directed by Dr Tim Williams and assisted on the organ by Edward McCall. St Wulfram's has over 45 treble choristers, and an additional teenage youth choir with a membership of 14, an adult choir, and 9 young people learning the organ. In the past

8 years, St Wulfram's choristers have won over 100 RSCM Awards (Bronze, Silver and Gold), and have visited 3 UK Cathedrals. They are delighted to return to York Minster.

Ullapool is about 90 minutes' drive from Inverness. Questionnaire from 'The Minority Anglican Project' The Edward Cadbury Centre for the Public Understanding of Religion, at the Philosophy, Theology & Religion dept. at Birmingham University, is conducting a research study commissioned by the Church of England on how we can better support Minority Ethnic Christians in the Church of England. We hope to be able to achieve a nuanced understanding of what it means to belong and to participate in Christian fellowship, within and beyond the Church of England.

You do not have to be either minority ethnic, or even a part of the C of E, to participate in the study. In a research vacuum, we need a broader parameter of data to understand the conditions specific to the C of E, and therefore we need control samples to understand a nuanced picture, so participants need only be: over 18 years old; live in the UK/British Isles; self-identify as a Christian.
