If there is anything that we need to know about your child, please speak with any of the leaders. When the administration of communion begins please go to the Zouche Chapel to collect your child so that they can share in this part of the service. Please ask a steward if you do not know where to find the Zouche Chapel and someone will show you the way.

Safeguarding day-to-day in the Minster

Part of our Safeguarding measures mean that at certain times of the day (Sundays from 11.00 am – 11.20 am and 3.35 pm – 3.50 pm; Monday-Saturday 4.50 pm until 5.10 pm) the North Quire Aisle and toilets are closed to members of the congregation, staff, volunteers and members of the public. Community Committee Meeting

Report of the Meeting of the Community Committee Meeting held on 6 November 2019. Andy Oates Chapter Clerk attended the meeting to report on the compilation and purpose of the community roll. It is a legal requirement for Cathedrals to have a roll and that it is a requirement for Chapter to maintain it. Its principal purpose is to provide an 'electoral college' from which 4 representatives may be elected to serve on the Cathedral Council, this happens every 3 years. Members are also elected to serve on the community committee and Deanery Synod. Until now the roll has been renewed every 3 years in advance of these elections which are due in Spring 2020. It is proposed that the current roll stays active rather than requiring people to re-join it and to undertake a drive both to update and expand it.

There was also a discussion about the Annual Meeting and it is proposed that this should be held in late May/Early June and might be combined with the proposed community day which will invite input into the next Strategic Plan.

There was a discussion about the data protection legislation and the restrictions it places on the use of data.

The meeting received reports about the work of the sub groups and progress on planning for next year. There was also discussion about the Come and See Mission which is to be held from 12 to 14 March 2020, planning for which has now begun. It was felt that we are likely to repeat many of the successful features of the Mission held in September 2018.

Updating the current Minster Community Roll

Every three years, we hold the Minster Community Elections, and everyone in our cathedral family is warmly invited to take part. If you are aged 16 or over and you worship, volunteer or work at the Minster, you are eligible to join the Minster Community Roll, our electoral register. It is important that our elections have the benefit of reliably up-to-date contact details for everyone who wants to be involved in this important event in the Minster's life. We are currently finalising the arrangements for the next elections, due to be held in May/June 2020, so now is the time to make sure that you are on the Community Roll so that you can have your say in the election result.

The elections appoint a new Minster Community Committee, and elect Minster Community representatives to our Cathedral Council and to York Deanery Synod – more information about these bodies and the work they do can be found here [bit.ly/303Y9ia] Full details of the election process will be published in due course.

We will be using the current Minster Community Roll for the 2020 elections. If you are already on the Roll, and none of your details have changed since you joined it, you don't need to do anything. If you need to update your details, or you are not yet on the Roll and would like to be added, please complete a Minster Community Roll application form and return it to: Minster Community Roll, Church House, 10-14 Ogleforth, York, YO1 7JN. Application forms are available from the Minster Community table in the Chapter House Vestibule on Sunday mornings, from the Vestry and from Church House Reception.

Please note that you must be on the current Minster Community Roll by Easter Day (Sunday 12 April 2020) to be eligible to take part in the Minster's 2020 elections.
