Now you have found the words, let's discover what they mean...

Jesus – the son of God. Christians believe that Jesus is God in the flesh.

Lent – the period before Easter, when Christians typically give up something they enjoy in honour of Jesus fasting in the wilderness.

Passiontide – the name for the last two weeks of lent.

Crucifixion – an ancient form of execution.

Cross – Jesus died on the cross for our sins.

Good Friday – the day when Christians commemorate Jesus' crucifixion.

Saviour – Jesus gave up (**sacrificed**) his own life to take away our sins.

Tomb – Jesus was buried in a tomb after he died, which was later found empty.

Mary – Mary Magdalene was one of the women who visited the tomb to anoint Jesus' body with spices and oils, but found it empty.

Angel – the women met an angel who told them that Jesus had raised from the dead.

Resurrection – Christians believe that Jesus was raised from the dead after his crucifixion.

Risen – Jesus was risen from the dead on the third day after Good Friday.

Celebrate – Easter is the most important festival in the Christian calendar and is a special time of celebration and **worship**.

Light – Jesus refers to himself as the 'light of the world', as he is a divine presence on earth.
