Safe Spaces

Safe Spaces is a free and independent support service, providing a confidential, personal and safe space for anyone who has been abused through their relationship with either the Church of England, the Catholic Church of England and Wales or the Church in Wales.

Victim Support have been commissioned to run this national service, providing remote support through our helpline, live chat service and website, for as long as the survivor needs. If face-to-face support is also required, contact and referrals will be made with appropriate local organisations depending on need.

Church of England Support Persons

House of Bishops (2017) Practice Guidance: Responding to, assessing and managing safeguarding concerns or allegations against church officers, states: *“A support person will be offered to all victims/survivors (of abuse). This could be an Authorised Listeners (primarily sexual abuse) or a Bishop’s Visitor (domestic abuse)”*

The Church of England is aware that those who have suffered abuse may value and be strengthened by the opportunity to speak in depth and in confidence*(within limits) to a sensitive listener.
