## ***Update on Emerging from Covid - Worship***

After the Community Eucharist on Zoom at 10.00 am on Sunday 4 July, the Dean will update the worshipping community about worship provision online and in person as we emerge from the pandemic and navigate an ever changing situation.

## ***Worshipping safely at the Minster***

It is reassuring seeing the number of vaccines administered, however the national guidance for places of worship has not changed, and to keep everyone safe we continue to require masks to be worn inside the Minster (except those who are exempt), physical distance between those not in bubbles, the use of hand sanitizer, details for track and trace, and no gathering in groups inside the Cathedral before or after services. Unless the weather is particularly eventful, there will be clergy outside the Minster following Sunday services, should you wish to talk to someone. We look forward to a time when we are able to welcome even more people more fully to worship here at the Cathedral.

#### ***Kibo Cranes***

Origami is the Japanese art of folding paper and has been practised for over 400 years. In Japan, cranes symbolise health and a thousand years of long life. Making cranes is an expression of hope, and the word for this in Japanese is kibō.

Inspired by this concept, York Minster and local artist, Penny Phillips, invite you to make origami cranes to express how you feel about the last

year. The cranes will be displayed in the central crossing of York Minster as part of a summer exhibition, Kibo Cranes, alongside cranes made by hundreds of other children.
