Worship Restrictions and Covid-19 Pandemic, an Update: Changes to Worship from Monday 19 July

This past week, the Senior Executive Team met and agreed the following in relation to worship at York Minster:

- We will no longer ticket Sunday services and intend to only implement ticketing for services where we anticipate large congregations
- Capacity for services will increase to 350 with gradual further increase over the next six months
 - Worshippers will be “strongly encouraged” to wear a mask in the building if they are able.
- We will continue to ask worshippers to enter their track and trace details at the entrance, either on paper or using the NHS app
- We await further detailed guidance from the Church of England on Holy Communion. We hope to begin congregational singing over the summer.

Worship will continue at 7.30am, 7.50am and 5.30pm Monday to Saturday, and on Sundays at 8am, 10am, 11am and 4pm.

On Sundays, we will continue to offer the Zoom Community Eucharist at 10.00 am each week, and live-stream the 11.00 am Eucharist and 4.00 pm Evening Prayer.

Worshippers may wish to keep some level of distancing and to facilitate this stewards will continue to exit the congregation row by row.

Whilst we await clarification on guidelines on Holy Communion we will continue to offer a simple sign of peace to one another (without shaking hands) and holy communion will continue to be administered in one kind.

As we emerge into Stage 4 of the government roadmap, our aim is to ensure that worshippers, staff and volunteers, feel safe, comfortable and cared for when attending worship in York Minster. We hope that with mutual respect and compassion we can continue to rebuild our worshipping community and welcome everyone to worship, whilst keeping all those affected by this global pandemic in our prayers.
