## **Community social Action**

### ***Support for the people of Afghanistan and British dependants being resettled in the UK***

The Community Committee agreed, at their meeting on the 1 September, to provide initial gifts of £250 each to The International Rescue Committee and the York City of Sanctuary. The International Relief Committee (IRC) has been working in Afghanistan since 1988 and has maintained its in country presence throughout the turbulence and difficulties of the past 33 years. Their focus is on providing mobile health clinics, safe learning spaces, support for uprooted families and finding livelihood opportunities.

The York City of Sanctuary (YoS) works closely with other Yorkshire cities to provide material gifts and support to families and individuals who have been evacuated with literally just the clothes on their backs.

We made the decision on which charities to support on the basis of a wish to assist the ongoing humanitarian relief effort to the people of Afghanistan and to ensure that local charitable efforts are publicised and helped.
