Lecture on the history of the Chancery Court of York in the Minster

On Thursday 23rd June the Vicar General of York, Peter Collier QC, has invited Professor Norman Doe to give a lecture on the history of the Chancery Court of York in the Minster at 6.45 pm following Evensong. The Chancery Court, the court of appeal of the Province of York in the Church of England, has existed since at least medieval times. The evolution of its jurisdiction, judiciary, and jurisprudence is at once a reflection of wider historic developments in the Church of England and the life of the Province of York within the national church. This lecture describes, explains, and evaluates the constitution and work of the court, and cases determined by it, in the light of continuity and change, and the stresses and strains placed on the court, as it has sought over the centuries to serve the people of the Province of York.

Norman Doe is a Professor of Law at Cardiff University, Director of its Centre for Law and Religion, Chancellor of the Diocese of Bangor, Academic Bencher of the Inner Temple, and Visiting Fellow at Clare Hall Cambridge. He has written ten books on modern ecclesiastical law and law and religion, served as consultant on canon law to the Anglican Communion, and is a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society.

Majesty: Monarchy and York Minster

14 May - 01 Jan 23 in the York Minster Treasure.

Discover York Minster's royal connections and collections through a new exhibition exploring the cathedral's centuries-old relationship with the monarchy in celebration of HM Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee. See Great Seals used to authenticate important documents by previous monarchs, a Minster Police truncheon with royal arms, and a Bible owned by Elizabeth Woodville, queen of King Edward IV, or their daughter Elizabeth of York. Other highlights include footage from the royal wedding of Prince Edward, Duke of Kent to his Yorkshire bride Katharine Worsley in York Minster in 1961 and Chinese silk gifted to Queen Victoria on her wedding day which has been transformed into burses and veils used in preparation for the celebration of Holy Communion. Visitors can also try on regal robes, bear a crown and sceptre, and pose for a majestic photograph showing off their best royal wave. Entrance to the exhibition is free with general admission.
